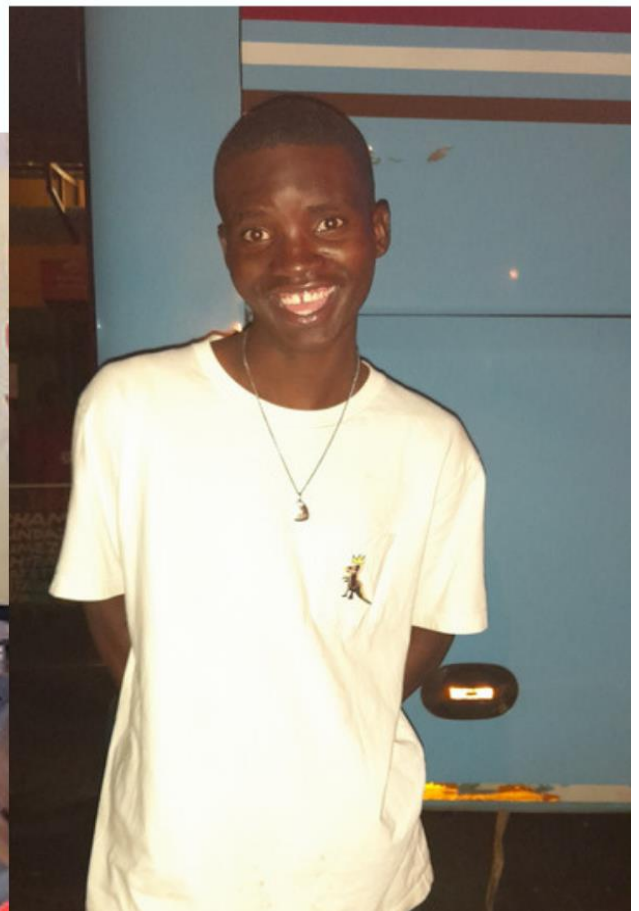

In our commitment to providing holistic support, we kept the boys engaged through prep time during the day in August. Additionally, we have been preparing the boys who are scheduled to write their grade 7 examinations this year. We are pleased to inform you that schools are set to reopen on September 4th, and one of our boys who is boarding has already left for school on September 2nd.



FEEDING PROGRAM

One of the major challenges we faced in August was the rising cost of mealie meal, which is a staple in the boys' diet. Due to the price increase, our monthly expenditure on mealie meal has substantially risen. Currently, the boys consume one bag of mealie meal per day, necessitating 30 bags per month. The escalating prices have put a strain on our resources, and we are actively seeking ways to address this issue.



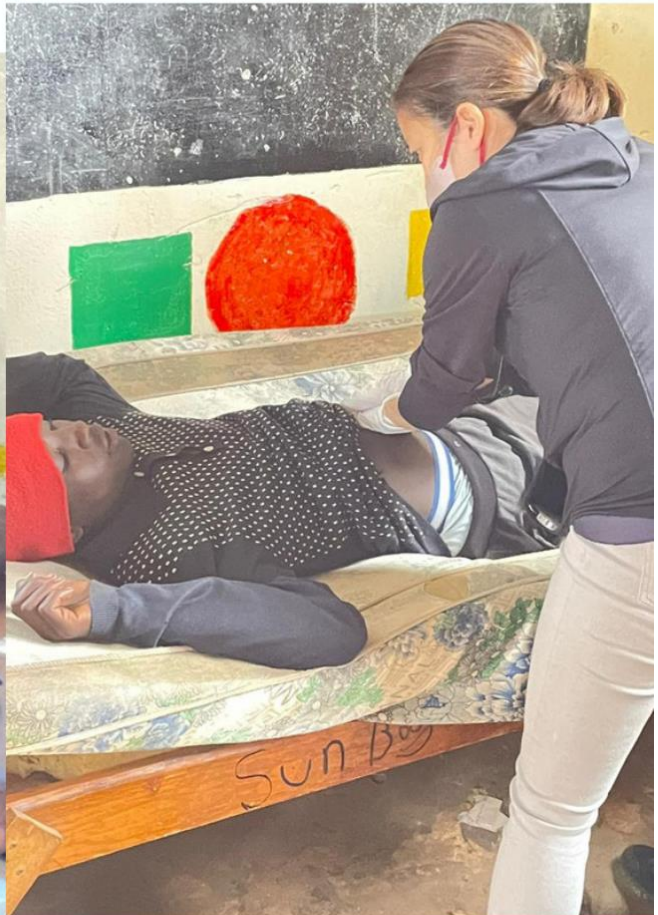
TRANSPORTATION SUPPORT
